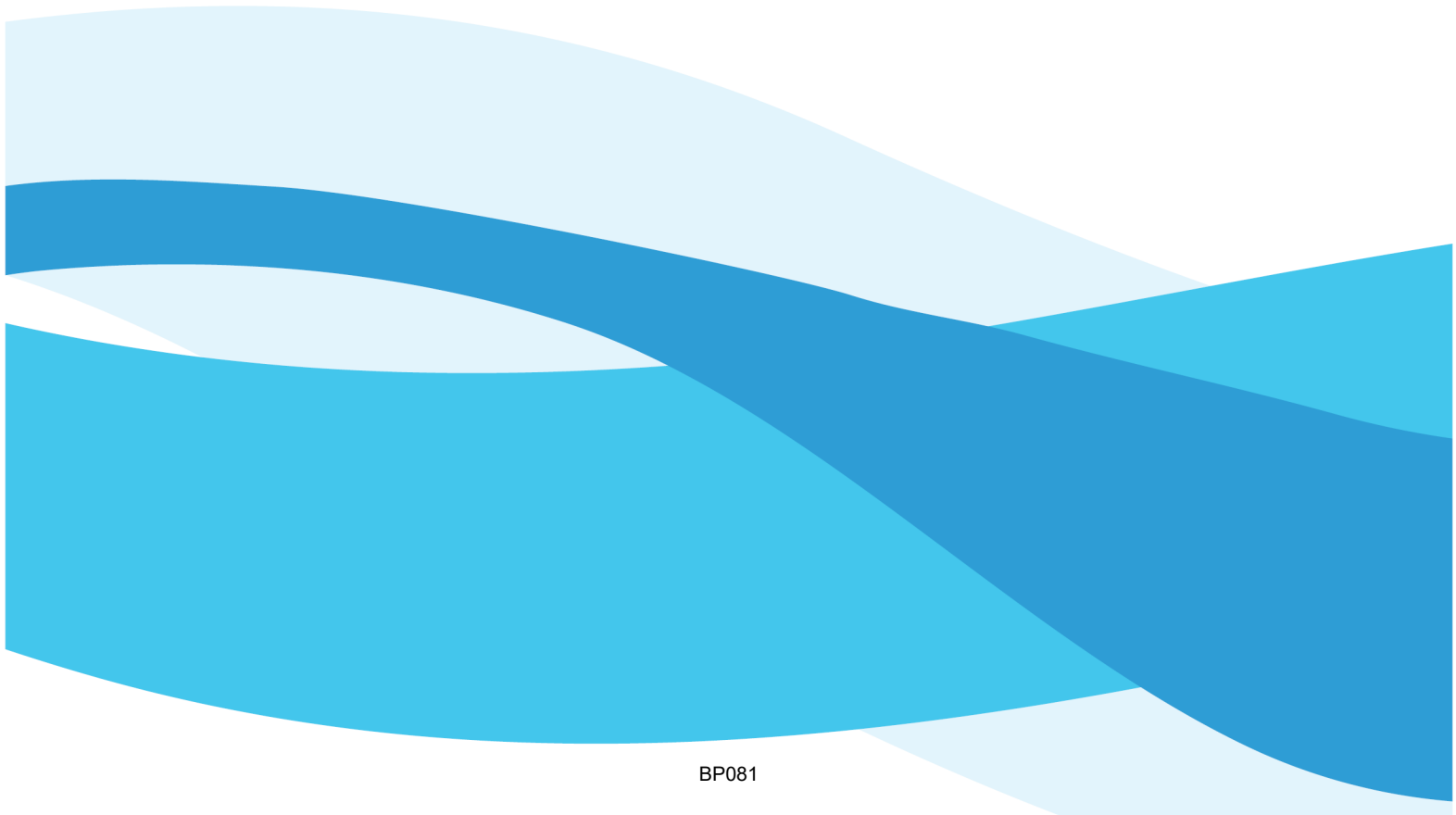

METRO WATER CYBERSECURITY ASSESSMENT

As part of the ongoing commitment to safeguard critical infrastructure, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) within the Department of Homeland Security, provides invaluable cybersecurity assessments to assist owners and operators. These assessments focus on enhancing the cybersecurity of industrial control systems, helping organizations better understand their vulnerabilities and build stronger defense-in-depth strategies to improve their overall cybersecurity posture.

Recently, Metro Water's IT department partnered with CISA for a comprehensive cybersecurity audit of our SCADA network. This collaboration offered us valuable insights and recommendations to bolster our security measures. We are currently reviewing the report provided by CISA and are in the process of developing a plan to implement the suggested improvements. This proactive approach will help ensure that our systems remain secure and resilient against evolving cyber threats.

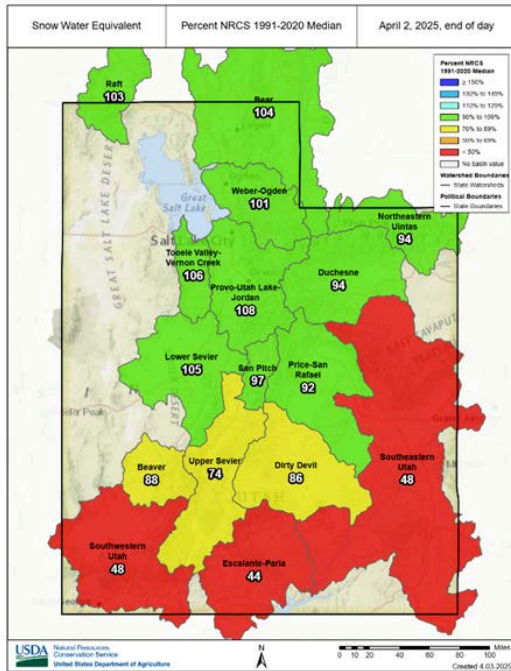


ULDC SOUTH BRANCH ENCLOSURE

The Utah Lake Distribution Company (ULDC) is undertaking a significant project to enclose the South Branch Irrigation Canal. This project is particularly relevant to Metro Water, as we are contracted to supply the water for this canal from our Jordan Narrows pump site. We also have infrastructure in place to meter the flow of water pumped to the canal. As this project will impact these facilities, our staff is actively collaborating with the ULDC project team to ensure the necessary adjustments are made and address any potential concerns throughout the project. We will continue to work closely with the team until the project's completion, ensuring minimal disruption and maintaining the integrity of our operations.

POMWTP RAW WATER RESERVOIR CLEANING

The cleaning of the Point of the Mountain Water Treatment Plant (POMWTP) raw water reservoir began on March 31st and required the combined efforts of our Maintenance, Facilities, and Operations departments. Despite the challenging weather conditions, the team showed remarkable determination and dedication. The effort involved a variety of equipment, including a Vactor truck, dump truck, and skid steer. However, the brunt of the cleaning was tediously done by staff with shovels, brooms and wheelbarrows due to the fragile lining of the reservoir. Staff finished each day raft in mud to ensure the reservoir was cleaned before the plant started. The project is now complete, a great accomplishment for all involved.



WATER SUPPLY PROJECTIONS

As we transition from winter to spring, water supply conditions are looking favorable. Reservoir levels began the water year at healthy levels and remain above normal for this time of year. Additionally, snowpack levels are above average, thanks in part to above-normal precipitation in February and March.

Recent streamflow forecasts suggest near- to slightly below-average yields from April through October. While April started with cool, wet weather, it appears that warmer and drier conditions are now taking hold for the remainder of the month. As temperatures rise and the weather dries out, we can expect the start of snowmelt runoff and an increase in water demands as outdoor watering activities ramp up.

We will continue to monitor conditions closely and ensure that our systems are prepared to meet the needs of our community throughout the spring and summer.
